New Illinois Accessibility Code

The new Illinois Accessibility Code (71 Ill. Adm. Code 400) was accepted at the October 16, 2018 Joint Committee on Administrative Rules. It is effective immediately and can be viewed and/or printed at https://www2.illinois.gov/cdb/announcements/2018/Documents/Register%20Page.pdf. A reformatted and more user friendly version of the Code will be published on CDB's website in the near future.

The purpose of this Illinois Accessibility Code is to implement the Environmental Barriers Act (EBA) [410 ILCS 25]. This Code is intended to establish minimum scoping and technical design requirements

to ensure that the built environment in the State of Illinois is designed, constructed, and altered to be accessible to and usable by all, including individuals with disabilities. It is also intended to resolve areas of difference between federal accessible design standards such as the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA), standards for accessible design (28 CFR 36 (2010) and the Code. The drafters of this Code compared and primarily adopted the stricter of State or federal accessible design standards to provide the greatest access throughout the State.

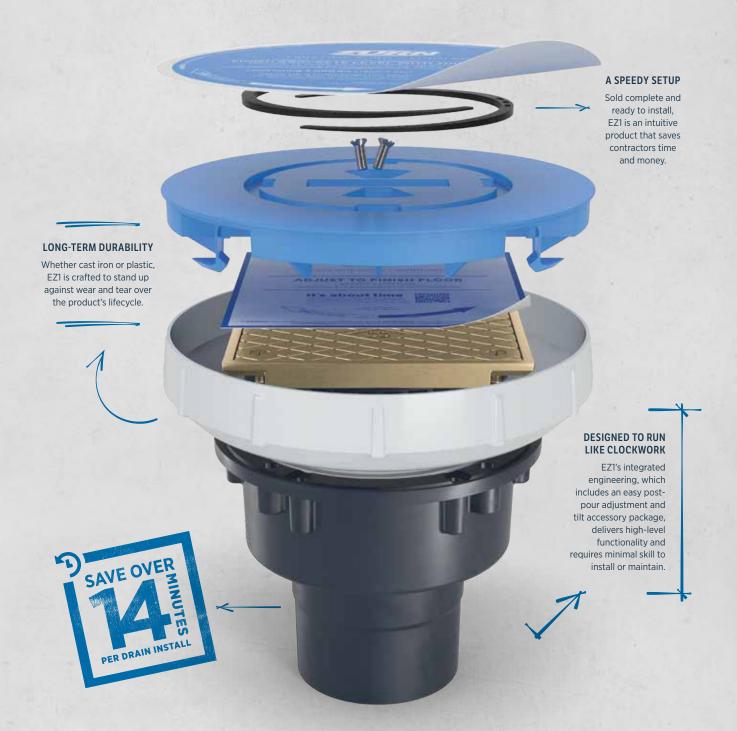



Changes to the "Home Repair: Know Your Consumer Rights" Brochure

Illinois law has required for many years that for any contract over \$1,000, any person engaging in the business of home repair and remodeling shall provide to its customers a copy of the "Home Repair: Know Your Rights" pamphlet prior to the execution of any home repair and remodeling contract. The consumer shall sign and date an acknowledgement form entitled "Consumer Rights Acknowledgement Form" and the contractor, or his representative, shall also sign and date the form, which includes the name and address of the home repair and remodeling business. The acknowledgement form shall be in duplicate and incorporated into the pamphlet. The original form shall be retained by the contractor and the duplicate copy shall be retained within the pamphlet by the consumer.

For contracts for \$1,000 or under, the contractor must provide the customer the pamphlet, but does not need to execute the written acknowledgement form.

HB 4268 made changes to the "Home Repair: Know Your Rights" pamphlet to include language informing the customer of their right to request lien waivers from the contractor. The bill was signed into law on August 3, 2018, and becomes effective on January 1, 2019.

Under Illinois law, the homeowner must request – and the contractor must provide – a written list of the names and addresses of "all parties furnishing material and labor and the amounts due or to become due to each". This list, or affidavit, must appear either as part of the contract or in a separate printed statement, and it must contain the following language: "THE LAW REQUIRES THAT THE CONTRACTOR SHALL SUBMIT A SWORN STATEMENT OF PERSONS FURNISHING MATERIALS AND LABOR BEFORE ANY PAYMENTS ARE REQUIRED TO BE MADE TO THE CONTRACTOR".

The law also requires every subcontractor listed in the affidavit to notify the homeowner, either personally or by certified letter, when he or she has furnished materials or performed labor on the homeowner's remodeling project. This notice preserves the subcontractor's right to put a lien on the property, and it must contain the name and address of the subcontractor

or material provider, the starting date of the work performed, the type of work performed or materials provided, and the name of the general contractor who requested the work to be done.

Contractors doing home repair and remodel work must begin using the new pamphlet by January 1. It is available for download from the Office of the Illinois Attorney General at http://www.illinoisattorneygeneral. gov/consumers/homerep0505c.pdf.







New Tax Law Allows Small Businesses to Expense More, Expands Bonus Depreciation

The Internal Revenue Service is reminding small business taxpayers that changes to the tax law mean they can immediately expense more of the cost of certain business property. Many are now able to write off most depreciable assets in the year they are placed into service.

The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA), passed in December 2017, made tax law changes that will affect virtually every business and individual in 2018 and the years ahead. Among those for business owners are tax rate changes for pass-through entities, changes to the cash accounting method for some, limits on certain deductions and more.

Section 179 expensing changes

A taxpayer may elect to expense all or part of the cost of any Section 179 property and deduct it in the year the property is placed in service. The new law increased the maximum deduction from \$500,000 to \$1 million. It also increased the phase-out threshold from \$2 million to \$2.5 million. These changes apply to property placed in service in taxable years beginning after Dec. 31, 2017. For most businesses, this means the 2018 return they file next year.

Section 179 property includes business equipment and machinery, office equipment, livestock and, if elected, qualified real property. The TCJA also modifies the definition of qualified real property to allow the taxpayer to elect to include certain improvements made to nonresidential real property. New 100 percent, first-year 'bonus' depreciation

The 100 percent depreciation deduction generally applies to depreciable business assets with a recovery period of 20 years or less and certain other property. Machinery, equipment, computers, appliances and furniture generally qualify. The law also allows expensing for certain film, television, and live theatrical productions, and used qualified property with certain restrictions.

The deduction applies to business property acquired after Sept. 27, 2017, and placed in service after Sept. 27, 2017, and before Jan. 1, 2023. In general, the bonus depreciation percentage is reduced for property placed in service after 2022. See the proposed regulations for more details.

Taxpayers may elect out of the additional firstyear depreciation for the taxable year the property is placed in service. If the election is made, it applies to all qualified property that is in the same class of property and placed in service by the taxpayer in the same taxable year. The instructions for Form 4562, Depreciation and Amortization, provide details.

WINTER DRIVING TIPS FROM ** IDOT - PREPARATION IS KEY



Winter weather can be unpredictable in Illinois, so preparation is a key part to staying safe when traveling. Throughout the winter, especially during adverse conditions, motorists should practice basic winter driving skills and build extra time into their schedules. As part of IDOT's "Winter Weather – Get it Together" campaign, all travelers are encouraged to follow these simple rules and tips during the winter months:

- Always wear a seat belt. It's the law in Illinois.
- Slow down. Slower speeds, slower acceleration, slower steering and slower braking all are required in winter driving conditions.
- Drop it and drive. Put down the handheld devices it, too, is the law in Illinois.
- Don't crowd the plow. A snowplow operator's field of vision is restricted. You may see them, but they may not see you.
- Avoid using cruise control in snow and ice.
- Watch out for black ice on roads that appear clear but can be treacherous.
- Be especially careful approaching intersections, ramps, bridges and shady areas. All are prone to icing.
- Do not travel during bad weather unless absolutely necessary. If you do have to make a trip, check the forecast and make sure someone is aware of your travel route. Consider taking public transportation if it is an option.
- Prepare an emergency kit that contains jumper cables, flares or reflectors, windshield washer fluid, a small ice scraper, traction material, blankets, non-perishable food and a first-aid kit.
- Carry a cell phone and a car charger in case of emergency.
- Follow Scott's Law. Slow down and move over for stopped emergency, construction and maintenance vehicles.
- For a list of suggested maintenance for your

car, visit the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration's winter driving website.

Before leaving the house, drivers are encouraged to check GettingAroundIllinois.com for continually updated information on winter road conditions, weather radars, road and bridge closures and other traffic-related information.

This winter, IDOT has more than 1,700 trucks available for deployment to plow almost 16,000 miles of roads statewide, the equivalent of driving from Springfield to the tip of South America and back. Last year, IDOT spread almost 305,000 tons of salt statewide.

10 Things You Don't Know About Your Foremen

I bet you think you know your foremen pretty well. You don't. Really.

They've been working for you forever, right? But you haven't really been paying attention.

Your foremen are the backbone of your company. And they are holding back on you. You're missing a lot by making assumptions about who they are and what they think. And those assumptions are costing you hundreds of thousands (if not millions) of dollars in lost profits over the course of their, and your, careers.

I've spent the last several years talking with and training several thousand foremen and superintendents all over the U.S. and Canada, so I know what I'm saying when I tell you, honestly, you don't have a clue what's going on inside their heads. Let's start by examining a list I put together of ten very important things you probably don't understand about your foremen.

- 1. Your foremen don't see themselves as professionals. They don't describe themselves that way. They don't see it as a professional position – in fact, they barely see it as a management position. If guvs who are going to manage \$100,000,000 to \$1 billion in projects over the course of their careers aren't professionals, then what are they? Maybe you should ask them.
- 2. On average, your foremen have received zero formal professional leadership and management training to prepare them for this high-level responsibility, role, and identity.
- 3. Your foremen don't know what they do for a living. When I ask them, a full 90% respond, "I'm a [Carpenter, Electrician, Pipefitter, Ironworker, ...fill in the craft]." This is the

- wrong answer. It reflects a craft-worker mindset, not a supervisory one. The correct answer is, "I am a professional construction foreman/ superintendent." It's very difficult for them to make that jump and not feel embarrassed, but how they see themselves determines how they act and lead on the job. They are no longer just "one of the guys".
- 4. Your foremen rarely solicit input from their crews. They a) think they will look weak, b) worry that someone else will get credit for a good idea and take their job, c) would never think to ask, or d) don't even know that it's part of their job.
- **5**. Your foremen run their crews almost 100% of the time using authority, not influence. Which approach do you think is more effective, productive and profitable?
- 6. Your foremen are often stuck between the roles of "boss" and friend. This kills the ability to discipline and hold others accountable for their actions.
- **7**. Your foremen do not effectively delegate. They are get-it-done people and therefore overparticipate in the action at the jobsite. They are excellent at directing tasks. They generally do not empower people and wouldn't know how to anyway. Wonder whose fault that is?
- 8. Your foremen often have confused lovalties between their roles as multi-million dollar company managers and union members. The peer pressure of being a "good union guy" is leveraged regularly by their peers, reducing their effectiveness and authority.

- **9.** Your foremen do not admit mistakes or failures. Failure is not a learning experience in their eyes; failure is simply failure.
- 10. Your foremen do not know how to effectively motivate their crews. The most effective and well-documented tools of praise and positive reinforcement are generally entirely absent. What was not given to them will not be given to others.

Now let's review. I'm willing to guess a few of the items on this list didn't come as a surprise to you. So the obvious question is, what are you doing to fix these attitudes among your foremen? By refusing to act or address the problems, you own them – they're all on you.

How about the attitudes and actions on the list that you didn't know about? Now that you do, what's your next move? Are you going to discuss them and provide your guys with the tools to address them, or just rationalize them away and take the path of least resistance?

Several hundred thousand foremen are waiting for help. They're doing the best they can with what they've got, but they need their employers to help them understand how important and vital they are to their company and the industry. They need serious professional support to become high-quality leaders and managers. But really, I think they're waiting for you to acknowledge the challenges.
