## **IN MEMORY**



Gerry Kennedy, Retired Foundation COO and National Association EVP, passed away on April 5th at the age of 80 after a short fight with cancer.

From 1997 to 2010, Gerry headed the Plumbing-Heating-Cooling Contractors (PHCC) Educational Foundation, first as Vice President of Education and then Chief Operating Officer. From 2010 until his retirement in 2015, he served as the PHCC—National Association Executive Vice President. In these roles, he developed and delivered programs that positively impacted the careers of countless individuals in the plumbing-heating-cooling industry.

In 2016, he funded a new annual PHCC Foundation scholarship to assist Boy Scouts interested in trades-related education. After retirement, he served as PHCC archivist while co-authoring a multi-year update to the "A Heritage Unique" PHCC history book that was published in 2019.

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## LEGISLATIVE UPDATE BY BEV POTTS

The Spring Session of the 103rd Illinois General Assembly is scheduled to adjourn on May 19th. Many of the bills we had been following are now considered dead for this session. Following are ones that are still active that we will be watching and working on.

### Plumbing/Piping/Trade Related Bills:

HB 1190 (B. Morgan) Amends the Illinois Underground Natural Gas Storage Safety Act to provides that, in the case of a verified facility release, the owner and operator of the underground natural gas storage facility is responsible for specified actions. Requires the maintenance and installation of monitors be done by an Illinois Licensed Plumber. Amended and passed the House and assigned to Senate Energy & Public Utilities.

### HB 1286 (K. Stuart)

Amends the Equitable Restrooms Act to provide any multiple-occupancy restroom maybe all-gender. Requires specified signage, stall dividers, and urinal partitions. Provides ratio requirements on the number of required fixtures. Requires IDPH to adopt rules to implement the provisions. Passed the House and assigned to the Senate Executive Committee.

### HB 2621 (S. Kifowit)

Provides that IDPH shall create a pilot program to allow the Department to enter into an agreement with a licensed plumber employed by a municipality to do inspections on behalf of the Department and submit appropriate documentation as requested to verify the inspections were completed to the standards required by the Department and outlined in the partnership. Passed the House and is on 3rd Reading in the Senate.

### HB 3046 (A. Williams)

Provides that the IEPA shall propose and the Board shall adopt (1) amendments to the Board's primary drinking water standards that will repeal the prohibition on the use of recycled sewage treatment plant effluent set forth in Title 35 and that will make any other revisions to those rules that are necessary to facilitate water reuse in the State and (2) rules establishing programs for both direct potable and nonpotable reuse of treated wastewater, including rules establishing permitting standards and a permit application process. Passed the House and is in Senate Assignments.

### SB 1715 (S. Hilton)

Amends the Illinois Plumbing License Law. Provides that the Department shall adopt a rule requiring that for each drinking fountain in any construction where a drinking fountain is required under the Illinois Plumbing Code, there shall also be a bottle filling station or a combined bottle filling station and drinking fountain. Passed in the Senate and assigned to the House Public Health Committee.

### SB 1804 (L. Murphy)

Provides that use of a refrigerant is not prohibited if the refrigerant is identified as a safe alternative under a specified federal statute and is contained within equipment that is in accordance with specified federal safety standards. Passed in the Senate and assigned to the House Energy & Environment Committee.

### SB 2368 (D. Koehler)

Creates the State Building and Residential Codes Act. Provides that the Capital Development Board, in consultation with the Department of Natural Resources, shall adopt a Building Code that establishes minimum requirements for the construction of commercial and residential buildings. Amended and passed in the Senate and assigned to the House Executive Committee.

### Other Construction/Business Related Bills:

### SB 133 (L. Holmes)

This is an initiative of our industry partner association, IMSCA, and it amends the Public Construction Bond Act to provide that a local

government entity may not withhold more than 5% retainage when a contractor has furnished a surety bond or its equivalent. On Calendar Order of 3rd Reading in the Senate with the passage date extended.

**SB 1570 (K. Lightford)** This bill would allow municipalities to utilize design/build. Passed the Senate and is on 2nd Reading in the House.

There are other bills we continue to watch that deal with Public Private Partnerships, Prevailing Wage, Procurement, Public Utilities, Indoor Air Quality/HVAC, Workforce, Energy, and more.

## **OSHA NEWS**

Thirty-nine people died doing trench or excavation work in the U.S. in 2022 – four in Illinois and two others in Ohio. In fact, the number of worker fatalities more than doubled since 2021, continuing a troubling trend cited by the Bureau of Labor Statistics that found 166 workers died in trench cave-ins from 2011-2018, an average of 21 each year.

To address injuries and fatalities in the industry, the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration is launching an outreach campaign in its Midwest region to work directly with employers, workers, state agencies and industry associations to reduce and prevent serious injuries and fatalities suffered by workers in one of the nation's most hazardous industries.

"A trench collapse can bury workers under thousands of pounds of soil and rocks in seconds, making escape and survival often impossible," explained OSHA Regional Administrator Bill Donovan in Chicago. "With proper training and use of required safety procedures, incidents like these can be prevented. OSHA and industry employers are working hard to raise awareness of hazards and protective measures and educate employers on how they must protect workers."

The new campaign is a collaboration between OSHA and on-site consultation projects across OSHA Region 5, including Illinois.

"By launching this trench and excavation safety campaign as the spring construction season gets into full swing, OSHA and its partners are determined to make sure industry workers finish their daily shifts safely," Donovan added.

In 2022, OSHA conducted 311 trenching and excavation inspections at sites in Illinois, Ohio and Wisconsin. Six of the inspections followed incidents in which workers suffered fatalities after falling into a trench, being pinned between equipment, trapped by a cave-in or asphyxiated by naturally occurring, hazardous gases in the trench. Industry employers and workers should remember the following essential trench safety standards:

- Protective systems must be in place for trenches 5-feet deep or deeper. These systems include benching, sloping, shoring and shielding.
- A registered professional engineer must approve trenches of 20-feet deep or deeper.
- A competent person must inspect trenches daily and as conditions change before anyone enters a trench. The competent person must be able to identify existing and predictable hazards, soil types and protective systems, and have authority to take prompt corrective action to eliminate those hazards.
- Excavated soils must be kept at least two feet from trench edges.

- Underground utilities must be located and marked before digging begins.
- Ladders must be positioned every 25 feet of lateral travel for safe entrance and exit from the trench.

OSHA has a national emphasis program on preventing trenching and excavation collapses, and developed a series of compliance assistance resources in English and Spanish to help keep workers safe from these hazards. OSHA's trenching and excavation webpage provides additional information on trenching hazards and solutions. including a safety video and safety alert.

### AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP RULES

Scholarships for college or vocational education are awarded by the Illinois Auxiliary for a minimum or \$500.00 up to a maximum of \$2,000.00 each year in June, as funds are available.

- 1. The applicant must be at least a freshman in college having completed one full semester with at least 8 credit hours of study. Seniors in high school may NOT apply.
- 2. No person may receive more than one award from the Illinois Auxiliary during his or her academic career. There cannot be more than two awards per family per year. A permanent list of recipients will be kept in the scholarship files.
- 3. In addition to the completed application form, the applicant must submit the following:
  - A letter from the applicant with personal data, family size, explanation of need for scholarship monies, and career plans. Also include information about participation in high school, college, and community activities as well as work experience. Knowledge of and/or working experiences with plumbing industry

may be included, but is not necessary.

- Three letters of recommendation.
- One letter must be from a sponsor who is a member in good standing of the Illinois PHCC Auxiliary.
- The other two letters must be from people who know the applicant personally and can attest to the applicant's character. They may also provide additional pertinent information such as academic performance and involvement in extra-curricular activities. Knowledge of parents does not necessarily qualify them for having knowledge of applicant.
- Photo of the applicant.
- Official transcripts—see details on application form.
- 4. The deadline for submitting the application is May 26, 2023.
  - Application must be postmarked no later than this date and include all the information required. If it is incomplete, application materials will be discarded and applicant will not be considered for a scholarship. Applicants may resubmit the following year.
  - The scholarship committee will have the final decision in awarding these scholarships. If you have any further questions, please feel free to contact Gail McWilliams.

## ILLINOIS PHCC PAST PRESIDENT'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP FUND

- 1. Name of the Scholarship Fund shall be the "Illinois PHCC Assn. Past President's Club Scholarship Award".
- 2. Scholarship is established through dues income to Past President's Club.
- 3. A scholarship shall be awarded to an individual who has been nominated by a member of the Illinois PHCC Past President's Club who has been a member in good standing for the past two years.
- 4. Applicant must have the following qualifications:
  - a. Applicant must be a member of the senior class or graduate of a secondary school.
  - b. Pursue or desire to pursue courses of study such as may prepare them to serve or to advance the interest of the plumbing-heating-cooling industry.
- The President of the Past President's Club shall be the Chairman and appoint two members to assist him in selecting the Scholarship Winner.
- 6. In no case shall more than one Scholarship be awarded to any one applicant, but the Scholarship Committee may award more than one scholarship at their discretion.

- 11. If a recipient should drop out of school during the year, the balance of the award should be returned to the Past

President's Club.
