As soon as you receive notification from the IDPH, please renew immediately. Do not wait until April to renew!

GET YOUR BACKFLOW TEST KIT CALIBRATED AT THE EXPO

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE BY BEV POTTS

The Spring Session of the 103rd Illinois General Assembly began on January 16th. New legislation has been introduced and bills from last year are still in play. There are many bills not included on this report that we are monitoring that deal with Energy Conservation, Workforce Development, Employment, Procurement, Design/Build, and Utilities/Water. If and when any of these advance we will add them to the list. Below are a few of the bills we are watching and their current status.

Plumbing/Piping/Construction Trade Related Bills:

HB 1198 (D. Vella) Provides that the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation shall create a program to license electricians in the State. Assigned to the House Labor & Commerce Committee.

HB 4173 (J. Davis) Amends the School Code to allows METT Educator District Licenses for teaching a course in manufacturing, engineering, technology, or a trade (including plumbing) to be issued. Assigned to the House Elementary & Secondary Education: Administration, Licensing & Charter Schools. We have asked the sponsor to add a provision that anyone teaching plumbing have a valid Illinois Plumbing License.

HB 4528 (J. Mason) Amends the Rental Property Utility Service Act. Provides that a landlord shall repair any leaking water pipe of a tenant within 30 days of the landlord being notified of a leak. Referred to House Rules. We requested the sponsor to amend the bill to state that these repairs must be made by a licensed plumber.

HB 4549 (A. Moeller) Amends the Illinois Plumbing License Law to provide that, beginning on July 1, 2024, food service establishments with less than 2,000 square feet may provide one unisex, readily accessible restroom facility for the public. Assigned to the House Executive Committee.

HB 4578 (M. Kelly) Creates an income tax credit for taxpayers who have an approved NFPA 13D residential fire sprinkler system installed in a new or existing residential dwelling. Referred to House Rules.

HB 4619 (H. Benton) Prohibits a homeowners' association, common interest community association, or condominium unit owners' association from adopting a bylaw or exercising any power that prohibits the installation of a rain water collection system or composting system. Referred to House Rules.

HB 4792 (D. Vella) Provides that the minimum lateral setback distance between a closed-loop well and a storm sewer, sanitary sewer, combined sewer, or any other potential source of contamination is 5 feet. Specifies that setbacks from footing drains and pits, crawl spaces, and basements do not apply to closed-loop wells. Assigned to House Energy & Environment Committee.

HB 5244 (L. Walsh) Amends the Energy Efficient Building Act. Requires the Board to adopt rules requiring all buildings to be designed and constructed to provide natural gas service and electric power. Specifies that a unit of local government may not enact or enforce a resolution, ordinance, rule, code, or policy, or take any other action that restricts or prohibits or has the effect of restricting or prohibiting the type of fuel source or source of energy production that may be used, delivered, converted, or supplied by a natural gas utility. Assigned to the House Energy & Environment Committee.

SB 1666 (R. Peters) Creates the Thermal Energy Network and Jobs Acts. The legislation defines thermal energy as piped noncombustible fluids used for

transferring heat into and out of buildings for all types of heating and cooling processes, including, but not limited to comfort heating and cooling, domestic hot water and refrigeration. Two proposed amendments are pending. Assigned to the Senate Subcommittee on Special Issues.

SB 1938 (D. DeWitte & D. Fowler) Amends the Environmental Protection Act to provide that, in the case of water main installation projects, all water main-related appurtenances, and specifically fire hydrants and valves, shall be included in the Agency's written approval of specified public water supply plans. Re-assigned to Senate Local Government.

SB 2702 (R. Villivalam) Amends the Fire Sprinkler Contractor Licensing Act. Provides that "fire sprinkler inspector" means an individual who is qualified to perform routine inspection or testing of fire sprinkler systems and who is exclusively employed by a single fire sprinkler contractor (instead of employed or contracted by a fire sprinkler contractor). Provides that any individual who performs routine inspection or testing of any fire sprinkler system under the Act shall be exclusively employed by a single licensed fire sprinkler contractor (instead of be employed by a licensed fire sprinkler contractor). Referred to Senate Assignments.

SB 2743 (L. Ellman & N. Toro) Creates the Water Plan Task Force Act. Establishes the State Water Plan Task Force and requires them to identify critical water issues, to develop and implement recommendations that address the critical water issues, and to reevaluate critical water issues and needs. Assigned to the Senate Environment and Conservation Committee.

SB 3792 (M. Simmons) Amends the Equitable Restrooms Act to provide that any multipleoccupancy restroom must be identified as an all-gender multiple-occupancy restroom and designated for use by any person of any gender. Provides that any existing or future places of public accommodation or public buildings are subject to the requirements regarding all-gender multiple-occupancy restrooms. Referred to Senate Assignments.

Other Construction/Business Related Bills: HB 4317 (J. Hoffman) Amends the Mechanics Lien Act. Requires the written notice to be sent by: (i) registered or certified mail, with return receipt requested; (ii) a nationally recognized delivery company with tracking service; or (iii) personal service. Provides that notice is considered served at the time the written notice is placed with the delivery service or in the mail. On 2nd Reading in the House.

HB 4418 (W. Davis) SB 2729 (R. Villivalam)

Provides that interest shall accrue monthly on the first day of each month on retainage withheld by a governmental unit; Requires retainage to be paid not more than 60 days after being retained. Referred to House Rules and Senate Subcommittee on Procurement.

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Question

One of our employees is constantly disregarding safety instructions. He recently injured himself at work and filed a workers' compensation claim. This is the third time in the past two years this has happened, and it will probably continue because he doesn't follow safety rules. Are we allowed to discipline him when workers' compensation is involved? I don't want to keep having these claims when it's his own fault for not following directions.



Employees who exercise their rights to file claims under state workers' compensation statutes are protected from retaliation. Disciplining an employee who has filed a claim (or has a history of filing claims) on account of an employer's desire not to have to deal with such claims may expose the employer to significant liability for retaliation. That said, employees who have experienced workplace injuries due to their own safety violations are not insulated against the consequences of having engaged in such infractions. An employer should proceed with discipline (up to and including termination) in a manner consistent with company policy and past practice, assuming any other employee who committed a similar safety violation would be disciplined as well. An employer should investigate the facts surrounding a breach of safety procedures, and if it's found that the employee violated a safety protocol, disciplinary action should be taken.

Remember that an employer may discipline an at-will employee for any legitimate, nondiscriminatory reason. Therefore, if an employer's decision to discipline or terminate an employee is based on his or her violation of a company's safety policy (and not because he or she exercised rights under workers' compensation laws), the employer can proceed, as long as doing so is consistent with company policy and past practice.

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EMPLOYERS MUST POST OSHA FORM 300A

OSHA reminds employers that they must post a copy of OSHA's Form 300A, which summarizes job-related injuries and illnesses logged during 2023. Each year, between February 1 and April 30, the summary must be displayed in a common area where notices to employees are usually posted. Businesses with 10 or fewer employees and those in certain low-hazard industries are exempt from OSHA recordkeeping and posting requirements. PAST PRESIDENT'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP FUND

- 1. Name of the Scholarship Fund shall be the "Illinois PHCC Assn. Past President's Club Scholarship Award".
- 2. Scholarship is established through dues income to Past President's Club.
- 3. A scholarship shall be awarded to an individual who has been nominated by a member of the Illinois PHCC Past President's Club who has been a member in good standing for the past two years.
- 4. Applicant must have the following qualifications:
 - a. Applicant must be a member of the senior class or graduate of a secondary school.
 - b. Pursue or desire to pursue courses of study such as may prepare them to serve or to advance the interest of the plumbing-heating-cooling industry.
- 5. The President of the Past President's Club shall be the Chairman and appoint two members to assist him in selecting the Scholarship Winner.
- 6. In no case shall more than one Scholarship be awarded to any one applicant, but the Scholarship Committee may award more than one scholarship at their discretion.
- 7. Scholarships shall be awarded at an event of the Illinois PHCC in June 2024.
- 8. The Executive Director shall be directed to inform the applicant who will be awarded the Scholarship.
- 9. Applicants not winning the award may be eligible to apply the following year.
- 10. The Scholarship money shall be made payable to the school of the applicant's choice. If the winner has changed schools since applying, he or she shall notify the IL PHCC Executive Director immediately.
- 11. If a recipient should drop out of school during the year, the balance of the award should be returned to the Past President's Club.

AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP RULES

Scholarships for college or vocational education are awarded by the Illinois Auxiliary for a minimum or \$500.00 up to a maximum of \$2,000.00 each year in June, as funds are available.

- 1. The applicant must be at least a freshman in college having completed one full semester with at least 8 credit hours of study. Seniors in high school may NOT apply.
- 2. No person may receive more than one award from the Illinois Auxiliary during his or her academic career. There cannot be more than two awards per family per year. A permanent list of recipients will be kept in the scholarship files.
- 3. In addition to the completed application form, the applicant must submit the following:
 - A letter from the applicant with personal data, family size, explanation of need for scholarship monies, and career plans. Also include information about participation in high school, college, and community activities as well as work experience. Knowledge of and/or working experiences with plumbing industry may be included, but is not necessary.
 - Three letters of recommendation.
 - One letter must be from a sponsor who is a member in good standing of the Illinois PHCC Auxiliary.
 - The other two letters must be from people who know the applicant personally and can attest to the applicant's character. They may also provide additional pertinent information such as academic performance and involvement in extra-curricular activities. Knowledge of parents does not necessarily qualify them for having knowledge of applicant.
 - Photo of the applicant.
 - Official transcripts—see details on application form.
- 4. The deadline for submitting the application is May 24, 2024.
 - Application must be postmarked no later than this date and include all the information required. If it is incomplete, application materials will be discarded and applicant will not be considered for a scholarship. Applicants may resubmit the following year.
