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UA LOCAL 149 WORKER WINS INTERNATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Just five years after he began his plumbing career, an East Central Illinois resident has been named one of the best in the industry, winning an international competition. Andrew Hall, a member of United Association Local 149, won the union's International Apprentice Contest, earning the honor after a week of multiple written tests, hands-on projects and interviews with international leaders.

He had previously won the local, state and district competitions, open to more than 50,000 apprentices. At the August competition in Ann Arbor, Mich., he bested the work of six other finalists from the U.S., Canada

and Australia – the first international title in Local 149 history. At the international competition, Hall and the other finalists spent five days competing in both classroom and hands-on tests, answering hundreds of questions that were both written and posed to them by the union's top training officials. They were also tasked with solving complicated plumbing projects and scenarios. All finalists received a silver ring for advancing and Hall will now get a gold ring, set to be delivered later this year.

Hall is in his fifth year with Local 149 and graduated from the union's apprentice training program in June. In each of those years, apprentices spend 240 hours in class and 1,700 hours on the job, earning the right to become journeymen. The Montrose native and Dieterich High School graduate spent his career at United Mechanical in Champaign (a PHCC member) before beginning a path earlier this year as a traveling plumber, selecting to work at various construction sites across the country.

Management has the sole authority to accept or reject an application to exhibit in any Illinois PHCC Expo and to determine which exhibitors are the best fit for attendees. An Exhibitor is an applicant for booth space that has been accepted for participation in the trade show by Management.

Booth Assignment: Management reserves the right to make all final decisions for booth assignment, layout, and configuration. Every effort will be made to assign the exhibitor's requested booth choices. Participation is at the sole discretion of Management and reserves the right to cancel any exhibitor.

Display Restrictions: All products, services, or literature displayed must fit within the allotted 8' x 10' booth space. Exhibits may not project beyond the space allotted or interfere with traffic, other exhibits, including line of sight. Exhibits may not extend into any aisle. Management reserves the right without recourse to prohibit any portion of any exhibit, which in its opinion is not suitable, or in keeping with the character of the event. This reservation of rights by Management applies to persons, things, conduct, printed matter, catalogs, and any other material relating to or affecting the event. No signs, banners, or flyers may be displayed or distributed outside of assigned booth space. MANDATORY SEXUAL HARASSMENT PREVENTION TRAINING

Public Act 101-0221 (commonly referred to as the Workplace Transparency Act), requires Illinois employers to provide sexual harassment prevention training to their employees on an annual basis, regardless of the size of the company.

Under this law, Illinois employers have until December 31st each year to train employees on sexual harassment prevention. The Act provides minimum standards that must be included in the training. To assist your business in complying with this new law, the Illinois Department of Human Rights has posted the following information on its website:

- A FAQ for Sexual Harassment Prevention Training
- Minimum Sexual Harassment Prevention Training Standards for All Employers

Employers must either develop their own sexual harassment prevention training program that equals or exceeds the minimum standards for sexual harassment prevention training outlined in Section 2-109(B) of the Illinois Human Rights Act, or they may use the model training provided by the IDHR. The model training program can be downloaded by visiting https://www2.illinois.gov/dhr/Training/Pages/State-of-Illinois-Sexual-Harassment-Prevention-Training-Model.aspx

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FMLA Leave for Childcare

Question

With the start of the school year, multiple employees have requested to use Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) leave to take care of their children when they have days off from school. These employees have not brought up any medical condition; our understanding is that they do not want to arrange for childcare and want to take days off to watch their kids themselves. Are we required to provide them with FMLA leave for regular childcare reasons?



The federal FMLA provides eligible employees with up to 12 workweeks of unpaid leave a year. Employees may use leave to, among other reasons, care for an immediate family member (including a child) with a serious health condition. When it is medically necessary, employees may take FMLA leave intermittently or on a reduced leave schedule. The need to watch children when they have a day off from school, without a medical reason involved, would not entitle an employee to FMLA leave. However, employers should ensure that there is no medical issue involved before denying an employee's request to use FMLA leave to care for their child. When an employee requests leave, they are required to provide enough information for the employer to know that the leave may be covered by the FMLA. The employer may ask additional questions to determine if the leave is FMLA-qualifying.

Employers should check state and local laws for any additional protections that may apply. It is also advisable for employers to work with local counsel to ensure they are complying with all legal obligations.





Suicide Prevention in Construction 5 Things You Should Know



The construction industry has one of the highest suicide rates of any occupation. Suicide deeply impacts workers, families, and communities. Fortunately, like other workplace fatalities, suicides can be prevented. Everyone in the construction industry has a role to play in suicide prevention. Below are 5 things to know about preventing suicide.











Everyone can help prevent loss by suicide.

Mental health and suicide can be difficult to talk about–especially with work colleagues–but your actions can make a difference. When you work closely with others, you may sense when something is wrong.

Know the warning signs of suicide.

There is no single cause for suicide but there are warning signs. Changes in behavior, mood, social media posts, or even what they say may signal someone is at risk. Take these signs seriously. It could save a life.

Ask "Are you okay?"

If you are concerned about a coworker, talk with them privately, be compassionate, and listen without judgment. Encourage them to reach out to your Employee Assistance Program (EAP), Member Assistance Program (MAP), the human resources (HR) department, or a mental health professional.

If someone is in crisis, stay with them and get help.

If you believe a coworker is at immediate risk of suicide, stay with them until you can get further help. Contact emergency services or the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline.
