




PHCC Educational Foundation Scholarships: Encourage Your Apprentices to Apply!

Proper training in the construction trades (and the related service/repair sector) will never be replaced as the key ingredient in what makes a journeyperson supremely qualified, capable, safe and efficient. Call me biased, but in my view plumbing and HVAC set the highest standards for hands-on and classroom instruction. As technology relentlessly improves the ways our society preserves water, handles waste

and enhances our comfort, continuing education remains crucial. But teaching plumbing and piping competency and expertise is *costly*, as is anything worthwhile.

The PHCC Educational Foundation for many of our union contractors is a "hidden treasure." To help offset portions of the expense of training in Joint Apprenticeship Committee (JAC) programs, scholarships are available. But because union contractors typically pay an hourly contribution to the JAC through a Collective Bargaining Agreement, they often are unaware or assume their apprentices or employees are not eligible for Foundation scholarships. Not true!

Plumbing or HVAC apprentices (in a union training program) who work for PHCC member companies are able and encouraged to apply for scholarships offered through the Educational Foundation. There are over \$150,000 in scholarship dollars to be pursued by the May 1, 2025 deadline! These funds are sent to and are earmarked by the apprentice's JAC program to cover or offset the costs of books, tools, required training equipment, fees and more. It's an additional value for PHCC members on behalf of the apprentices they employ. To learn

EMPLOYERS MUST Post OSHA Form 300A

OSHA reminds employers that they must post a copy of OSHA's Form 300A, which summarizes job-related injuries and illnesses logged during 2024. Each year, between February 1 and April 30, the summary must be displayed in a common area where notices to employees are usually posted. Businesses with 10 or fewer employees and those in certain low-hazard industries are exempt from OSHA recordkeeping and posting requirements. PHCC EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION TO UPDATE NATIONAL HVAC CONTEST, MERGING MODERN Skills with Future Tech

The Plumbing-Heating-Cooling Contractors— National Association (PHCC) Educational Foundation has announced major updates to its National HVAC Apprentice Contest. The annual event will be redesigned this year, with a focus on creating a competition addressing the skills apprentices need today, plus the technology they can expect to work with in the future.

The PHCC of South Dakota chapter, whose members are spearheading the redevelopment of the contest, will host the first pilot of the redesigned contest at their state convention in February 2026. No HVAC contest will be held in Grand Rapids during CONNECT 2025, but a special HVAC exhibit area previewing the new competition is being discussed for exhibit on the tradeshow floor.

"This strategic pause gives our contractor volunteer experts the time they need to enhance the competition and create new learning opportunities for apprentices," said Daniel Quinonez, chief operating officer of PHCC. "We're taking this opportunity to completely revamp the program to better align with the realworld challenges our apprentices face daily and to incorporate the rapid advancement of technology within the HVAC field."

Patrick Wallner, PHCC Educational Foundation chairman, added, "This redesign will benefit both the industry and PHCC, creating an opportunity for us to take a fresh look at how we can reshape this event for the future. It's an exciting time to choose a career in HVAC, and we want to ensure this educational experience includes the latest skills and technologies that the next generation needs as they start their journey in the industry."

A dedicated team of PHCC contractor members, led by Dan Hartman of Wolff's Plumbing and Heating and Brett Kaltvedt of Midwestern Mechanical, will spearhead the contest redesign. Their goal is to develop a competition format that can be replicated by other PHCC state chapters, creating a scalable model for technical excellence across the industry.

The Foundation will release additional information about the enhanced competition format in the coming weeks, with registration details for the 2026 event to follow. The PHCC Educational Foundation's National Plumbing Apprentice Contest will occur as planned at CONNECT 2025, Oct. 27-30 in Grand Rapids.





LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The Spring Session of the 104th Illinois General Assembly began on January 8th with the swearing in of newly elected legislators. New legislation is being introduced daily with over 3700 bills already introduced. It is expected that we will see around 7,000 bills introduced. Many of these bills are shell bills with substantive language to be added later. We have been monitoring and reviewing each piece as it is introduced. The bill introduction deadline date is February 7th in both the Senate and the House. The scheduled adjournment date for the General Assembly this year is May 31th. There are many bills that deal with Energy Conservation, Workforce Development, Employment, Procurement, and Utilities that we will be carefully watching to see how they may affect our industry. Below are a few of the bills we are watching and their current status.

Plumbing/Piping/Trade Related Bills:

HB 1051 (D. VELLA) Amends the Illinois Water Well Construction Code. Provides that the minimum lateral setback distance between a closed-loop well and a storm sewer, sanitary sewer, combined sewer, or any other potential source of contamination is 5 feet. Specifies that setbacks from footing drains and pits, crawl spaces, and basements do not apply to closed-loop wells. Referred to House Rules.

HB 1112 (J. DAVIS) Amends the School Code to allow METT Educator District Licenses for teaching a course in manufacturing, engineering, technology, or a trade (including plumbing) to be issued. Referred to House Rules.

HB 1370 (D. DIDECH) Amends the Environmental Protection Act to provide that after January 1, 2030, no person shall sell in the State a new washing machine for residential or commercial use unless the washing machine contains a microfiber filtration system. This can be an integral filter in the machine or an in-line filter. Referred to House Rules.

HB 1612 (K BUCKNER) Creates the Illinois Appliance Standards Act. Directs the Illinois EPA to adopt minimum efficiency standards for covered products. Provides for testing, certification, and labeling of covered products. These standards will apply to commercial and residential faucets, water coolers, water heaters, toilets, urinals, showers, irrigation controllers and more. Referred to House Rules.

HB 1809 (K. STUART) Provides that the Capital Development Board shall establish uniform statewide minimum qualification requirements for code inspectors and shall maintain a statewide registry and certification program for qualified inspectors to demonstrate their compliance with the minimum qualification requirements. Provides that any municipal building code or county building code must ensure that all code inspectors meet at least the minimum certification requirements required by the Board for non-building code jurisdictions. Referred to House Rules.

HB 1849 (R. SPAIN) Amends the Energy Efficient Building Act to provide that the term "Code" means the 2021 edition of the International Code Council's International Energy Conservation Code (currently, the latest published edition). Referred to House Rules.

SB 224 (D. DEWITTE) Amends the Environmental Protection Act to provide that, in the case of water main installation projects, all water main-related appurtenances, and specifically fire hydrants and valves, shall be included in the Agency's written approval of specified public water supply plans. Referred to Senate Assignments.

OTHER CONSTRUCTION/BUSINESS RELATED BILLS:

HB 1224 (W. DAVIS) Creates the State Agency Retainage Act. Provides that, if a State agency determines that satisfactory progress has not been achieved by a contractor or subcontractor during any period for which a payment is to be made, a percentage of the payment may be retained by the State agency. Prohibits the amount of retainage under the Act from exceeding 10% of the amount of any and all draw amounts submitted and approved under the terms of the contract until the contract is 50% completed. Prohibits retainage of more than 5% of the contract of the amount of any and all draw amounts submitted and approved under the terms of the contract for the duration of the contract. Authorizes retainage to be adjusted as the contract approaches completion to recognize better than expected performance, the ability to rely on alternative safeguards, and other factors. Further provides that on completion of all contract requirements, amounts retained under the Act must be paid promptly. Specifies that the State Prompt Payment Act does not apply to retainage withheld under the State Agency Retainage Act.

Referred to House Rules.

HB 1247 (D. VELLA) Amends the Prevailing Wage Act to provide that the definition of "public works" includes sewer inspection projects that utilize a closed-circuit television to identify issues in a sewer system. Referred to House Rules.



ILLINOIS PHCC PAST PRESIDENT'S **CLUB SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

- 1. Name of the Scholarship Fund shall be the "Illinois PHCC Assn. Past President's Club Scholarship Award".
- Scholarship is established through dues income to Past President's Club.
- 3. A scholarship shall be awarded to an individual who has been nominated by a member of the Illinois PHCC Past President's Club who has been a member in good standing for the past two years.
- 4. Applicant must have the following qualifications:
 - Applicant must be a member of the senior class or graduate of a secondary school.
 - Pursue or desire to pursue courses of study such as may prepare them to serve or to advance the interest of the plumbing-heating-cooling industry.
- The President of the Past President's Club shall be the Chairman and appoint two members to assist him in selecting the Scholarship Winner.
- 6. In no case shall more than one Scholarship be awarded to any one applicant, but the Scholarship Committee may award more than one scholarship at their discretion.
- Scholarships shall be awarded at an event of the Illinois PHCC in June 2025.
- The Executive Director shall be directed to inform the applicant who will be awarded the Scholarship.
- 9. Applicants not winning the award may be eligible to apply the following year.
- 10. The Scholarship money shall be made payable to the school of the applicant's choice. If the winner has changed schools since applying, he or she shall notify the IL PHCC Executive Director immediately.
- 11. If a recipient should drop out of school during the year, the balance of the award should be returned to the Past President's Club.

Question

Can we require that nonexempt employees work on holidays? Some of our employees said that they should not be required to work on holidays and that, if they do, we owe them extra pay. Is any of this true? These are nonexempt employees in California.

NSWER

On the federal level, the Fair Labor Standards Act does not require payment for time not worked, such as holidays (federal or otherwise). Similarly, according to the California Labor Commissioner, California law does not require that an employer provide its employees with paid holidays, close its business on any holiday, or give employees the day off for any particular holiday. Additionally, there is nothing in California law that mandates an employer to pay an employee a special premium for work performed on a holiday other than the overtime premium required (if overtime is worked).

Of course, employers should check their applicable state/local laws, as requirements may vary depending on location. When federal and state standards are different, the rules that provide the most protection to employees will apply.

That said, even if not required, providing employees with holidays off (or paying employees a special premium if they work on holidays) may help increase employee morale and make employees feel valued by the organization. Providing this time off may also help decrease the negative effects that can be caused by working too much, such as employee burnout, dissatisfaction, and turnover. Employers should take such considerations into account when deciding whether to require employees to work on holidays (and how much to pay them if they do).

AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP RULES

Scholarships for college or vocational education are awarded by the Illinois Auxiliary for a minimum or \$500.00 up to a maximum of \$2,000.00 each year in June, as funds are available.

- 1. The applicant must be at least a freshman in college having completed one full semester with at least 8 credit hours of study. Seniors in high school may NOT apply.
- 2. No person may receive more than one award from the Illinois Auxiliary during his or her academic career. There cannot be more than two awards per family per year. A permanent list of recipients will be kept in the scholarship files.
- 3. In addition to the completed application form, the applicant must submit the following:
 - A letter from the applicant with personal data, family size, explanation of need for scholarship monies, and career plans. Also include information about participation in high school, college, and community activities as well as work experience. Knowledge of and/or working experiences with plumbing industry may be included, but is not necessary.
 - Three letters of recommendation.
 - One letter must be from a sponsor who is a member in good standing of the Illinois PHCC Auxiliary.
 - The other two letters must be from people who know the applicant personally and can attest to the applicant's character. They may also provide additional pertinent information such as academic performance and involvement in extra-curricular activities. Knowledge of parents does not necessarily qualify them for having knowledge of applicant.
 - Photo of the applicant.
 - Official transcripts—see details on application form.
- The deadline for submitting the application is May 23, 2025.
 - Application must be postmarked no later than this date and include all the information required. If it is incomplete, application materials will be discarded and applicant will not be considered for a scholarship. Applicants may resubmit the following year.
 - The scholarship committee will have the final decision in awarding these scholarships. If you have any further questions, please feel free to contact Gail McWilliams.
